Women Leaders in Sports Professional Development

Chi Alpha Sigma is proud to partner with Women Leaders in Sports to create a unique career development opportunity for inductees seeking a career in athletics as either a coach or administrator. A cohort of Chi Alpha Sigma inductees will be chosen in each fall semester to participate in the following:

- Special introductory meeting specifically for this group
- Participate in the Rising Stars mentorship program
- Participate in yearlong Women Leaders in Sports professional development sessions
- Networking with industry leaders and potential future employers

Awards and Scholarships

Chi Alpha Sigma announced its first-ever National Scholar-Athletes of the Year in 2019. Each summer, the organization will recognize one male and one female student-athlete who have demonstrated academic and athletic achievement, as well as service and leadership both oncampus and in the community. Nominees must be junior or senior Chi Alpha Sigma inductees who have maintained a minimum of a 3.50 cumulative grade-point average (GPA) throughout their collegiate careers and demonstrated how their experiences as scholar-athletes have influenced and empowered them to be successful after graduation.

The Nick Mourouzis Postgraduate Scholarship endowment was created to award scholarship funding to a previously inducted student-athlete who has exhausted all of their eligibility and will be seeking a postgraduate degree. Application information for both the National Scholar-Athletes of the Year and the Nick Mourouzis Postgraduate Scholarship is sent to chapter advisors annually to assist with nominating eligible inductees.

<u>Washington Internship Institute</u> - all inducted student members of the ACHS societies will be awarded a \$500 merit-based scholarship for the ACHS/WII Washington Internship Program.

<u>The Fund for American Studies</u> - one inducted student member of each of the ACHS societies will be awarded a merit-based \$1000 scholarship for a TFAS Summer Institute or Capital Semester.

<u>The Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars</u> – awards a \$1,000 housing scholarships to selected students who are members of ACHS honor societies.



<u>The Osgood Center</u> - offers a \$500 scholarship to be applied to the cost of its internship program in Washington, D.C. This scholarship is automatically awarded to any student who is a member of an ACHS member society.

<u>The PhD Project</u> – encourages ACHS member society students to participate in an expansive network of support that helps African-Americans, Hispanic-Americans and Native Americans attain their business Ph.D., become business school professors and serve as role models to attract the next generation of minority business leaders.

<u>United Planet</u> – offers one merit based scholarship for an inducted student member of each chapter within every ACHS member society per calendar year in the amount of \$500 scholarship for any United Planet international program in one of over 35 countries. United Planet also awards five merit-based scholarships for alumni in every ACHS society per calendar year in the amount of \$500 for any United Planet international program in one of over 35 countries, and offers preferred program fees and support for chapter, society-wide, and alumni groups.
